The Old Chapel in Gotherington was built in 1833 and was originally owned by the Countess of Huntingdon's Trust. Today, the building is owned by The Old Chapel Community Project (Registered UK Charity No. 1179607), a charity set up in 2018 by residents of Gotherington, who wanted to ensure that The Old Chapel would remain a place the community could use for years to come. >>> FIVE ACRES HIGH SCHOOL

Five Acres High School is addressing the digital divide by supporting its students and their families. DAISI will be attending an open evening where they will discuss access to data and devices, online safety, spotting fake news, and digital wellbeing.

The initiative aims to ensure students have access to the internet and the best technology for their homework and learning journey. Additionally, resources for parents on social media privacy settings will be provided to help keep families safe online. This support aims to instil confidence in parents, carers, and students as they begin this new educational chapter.







>>> PHOTOGRAPHY FOR WELLBEING WORKSHOP 14TH JUNE 2025



On Saturday 14th June, we took a group of community members who are being supported by our North Cotswolds Social Prescribing Link Workers to Westonbirt Arboretum.

Bo, our Digital Equity Team Lead, utilised their photography degree to create a photography for wellbeing workshop. The group were tasked with 10 photo challenges that combined gentle physical activity with mindful observation, encouraging participants to connect with nature and think creatively.

The workshop aimed to reduce stress, enhance appreciation for the present moment, and boost overall mental and emotional health.

>>> VITAL DIGITAL AND TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT IN THE NORTH COTSWOLDS

What happens when Jason Spinney, our Digital & Technology Inclusion Social Prescribing Link Worker, visits patients at home?

Below is an example of what Jason's work could involve: A clinician referred an elderly couple, Mr. and Mrs. A, to the digital team for crucial support. Mr. A's early-stage dementia and Mrs. A's significantly limited speech due to a stroke presented unique communication challenges. Their initial request was for software to help Mrs. A verbalise words and sentences – a need that became even more vital as Mr. A's dementia progressed.





Jason introduced an Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) board. This innovative tool features categorised words that can be used individually or to form short sentences. While not a perfect solution, free versions offer a valuable verbal outlet when needed. Jason's support didn't stop there; it expanded to include iPad syncing, account security, and ensuring broadband connectivity, all essential for the couple to utilise this vital communication aid effectively.

An 11-week course is now underway at the George Moore Community Centre in Bourton on the Water! A course attendee provided this feedback to Ken, our volunteer course lead:

"I am certainly one of the much older members of the community, and now have great difficulty with all today's technology, somehow my mind appears to put up barriers and generates a general fear that I will get into a silly situation, that disables me. So I wanted to tell you that although your course is presented very well indeed, the "icing on the cake" is the quality of the notes you provide with each session. They avoid the need to make lots of hand written notes, and are wonderfully helpful afterwards, to enable me to recall what was said, and discussed. They are also excellent as a reminder at a later date. Thank you for putting such energy into creating the notes in glorious colour."

We are incredibly grateful to our team of volunteers in the North Cotswolds and their passion for supporting their local community to access the online world one click at a time.

The RISE service provided by CASA offers structured, personalised, one-off support and advice to autistic adults. DAISI are working with CASA to ensure digital support is available for all. These sessions last for one hour and can be in person, over the phone or online.

>>> BBC POINTS WEST WITH OUR PARTNER ITSA DIGITAL TRUST

In June 2025, DAISI was featured on BBC's regional news, offering a powerful glimpse into how community-led digital inclusion is changing lives across Gloucestershire. The segment focused on DAISI's collaboration with ITSA Digital Trust, highlighting efforts to provide refurbished laptops and connectivity support to some of the county's most digitally excluded individuals.





Daniel Gale, GRCC's Digital Equity Manager, visited individuals in their homes, distributing devices and providing personalised support. This highlighted DAISI's core values of trusted local relationships, ethical delivery, and a human-first approach to technology.

The report highlighted that digital access extends beyond devices, connecting individuals to health services, education, employment, and family. A recipient shared that receiving a device helped them attend medical appointments and reconnect socially.

As digital barriers and poverty persist as pressing issues, the BBC feature illustrated how local initiatives can create tangible, scalable impact. DAISI continues to prove that with the right support, every person deserves - and can achieve - digital connection... *one click at a time*.

RUSTIK PROJECT – GRCC BRINGS GLOUCESTERSHIRE'S VOICE TO FINLAND

In June 2025, GRCC (Gloucestershire Rural Community Council) took part in the international RUSTIK project meeting held in Joensuu, Finland. This gathering brought together rural-focused partners from across Europe to share approaches for navigating social, economic, and digital change in rural areas.

GRCC represented Gloucestershire's rural communities as part of the Gloucestershire 'living lab', alongside academic partners from the University of Gloucestershire and its CCRI team, with Daniel Keech and Katarina Kubinakova involved with the living lab.

Daniel Gale, GRCC's Digital Equity Manager, and Katarina discussed progress from sharing how locally-led, ethical digital transition are making a difference in health, education, and wellbeing across the county, through the use of data.



The meeting focused on learning from each other's "Living Lab" pilots. GRCC shared its theory of change around rural digital access, open-source innovation, and how trusted relationships underpin sustainable digital transformation. Conversations highlighted shared rural challenges: ageing populations, poor connectivity, and the importance of face-to-face support.

The Finnish hosts offered tours of different sites and places around the Joensuu region. GRCC's community-first approach drew attention from other European partners, who saw value in co-designed, inclusive methods.

As the only UK VCSE organisation in the project, GRCC is helping shape a vision for equitable digital rural futures, grounded in real voices, real needs, and lasting impact.
